- ◆ Two completed recommendation forms from current employer or professional persons familiar with the applicant's work or college performance.
- ◆ Full-time employment or substantiated prior full-time work experience.
- ◆ Current resume.
- ◆ Admission interview with a member of the faculty of the School of Business Admission Committee.

## Unique or Special Characteristics of the School of Business Programs

- An emphasis on ethical and professional behavior in all types of organizations and environments.
- Opportunities for extensive networking through courses, teamwork, faculty, community, and organizational leaders.

2. Two letters of recommendation from current employer or professional individuals familiar with the applicant's work or college performance.
3. Full-time employment or substantiated prior full-time work experience.
4. A copy of a current resume.
5. Admission interview with a member of the School of Business Admission Committee.

### **Transfer Students**

Students may transfer up to 6 semester hours of credit with departmental approval.
